L1: Role models: Religion in sport- Mo Salah

Islamophobia	The fear, hatred of, or prejudice against the Islamic religion or Muslims.	
The five pillars of Islam	One of the major guiding principles for Muslims to follow on how to act/ behave are the Five Pillars of Islam. These are five duties which Muslims should follow. They are based on order of importance based on how frequently they are completed	
Shahada (Faith)	The declaration of faith in one God (Allah) and His messenger (peace be upon him).	
Salah (Prayer)	The ritual prayer required of every Muslim five times a day throughout their lifetime.	
Zakat (Almsgiving)	The act of giving a portion of a Muslim's wealth to those in need throughout their lifetime. (2.5%)	
Sawm (Fasting)	The act of fasting during the holy month (9 th) of Ramadan.	
Hajj (Pilgrimage)	The sacred pilgrimage to Mecca required of every Muslim at least once in their lifetime if it is within their means.	
Role Model	A person looked to by others as an example to be imitated.	


L3: Role models: LGBTQ rights Bishop Christopher

Liberal Christian	Interprets Christian teaching by taking into consideration modern knowledge, science and ethics.	
Conservative Christian	Adhere to what many consider to be conservative religious values of the Christian faith.	
LGBTQ rights in Uganda	Lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) people in Uganda face legal challenges. Activists estimated in 2007 that the Ugandan LGBT community consisted of 500,000 people, however, both male and female homosexual activity is illegal.	
Christopher Senyonjo	A clergyman and campaigner for LGBT rights in Uganda. He was elevated to Bishop in the Church of Uganda in 1974 and retired in 1998. In 2001, he was barred from performing services.	
Homophobia	Dislike, fear or prejudice against gay or lesbian people.

Taliban	A radical terrorist armed group located along the Afghan and Pakistan border.	
Malala Yousafzai	Pakistani girl shot by the Taliban. She is an ambassador for women's rights across the world.	
Nobel peace prize	Malala Yousafzai was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for her fight for the right of every child to receive an education.	
Gender Inequality	A social construct whereby men and women are not treated equally.	

L2: Role models: Religion in sport- Muhammad Ali

Pacifist	A person who believes that war and violence are unjustifiable.	
Conscientious objector	An "individual who has claimed the right to refuse to perform military service on the grounds of freedom of thought, conscience, or religion." 	
Muhammad Ali	Muhammad Ali was one of the most famous conscientious objectors to the Vietnam War.	
Desmond Doss	Desmond Doss was a Seventh-day Adventist conscientious objector during World War II, meaning he opted against carrying a gun while serving in active duty. He became famous for receiving the Congressional Medal of Honor for bravery amid combat while upholding his principled stance.	

L5: Role Models: Religion and race inequality- MLK

Civil rights	The rights of citizens to political and social freedom and equality.	
Martin Luther King	An American Baptist minister and activist, one of the most prominent leaders in the civil rights movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968. An African American church leader. King advanced civil rights for people of colour in the United States through nonviolence and civil disobedience.	
Protestant Christian	A protestant is a Christian who does not follow the catholic denomination but rather adheres to Protestantism, a denomination that resulted because of a reform movement initiated in Germany and France in the 16th century.	
MLK quote	"I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the colour of their skin but by the content of their character"	
"Love thy neighbour."	Means respecting others and regarding their needs and desires as highly as we regard our own.	
Agape	Unconditional Christian love for all.	
Justice	Just behaviour or treatment. It refers to individuals being treated in a manner that is equitable and fair. To achieve justice, individuals should receive the respect they deserve. What people 'deserve' is subjective, depending on the perspective of those involved.
