You **must not** become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.

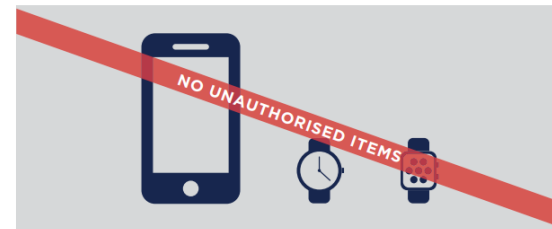

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Be organised



Your exam card has been reprinted and will be kept in school and placed on your exam desk for each exam. Do not take this away.



Keep your exam timetable safe. Students in the Sports hall will need to remember their seat number for all exams. This will be on your timetable and will be displayed in various places before your exams.



Bring your stationery and calculator including maths stationary – your pencil case must be clear, and you must remove the case from your calculator.



Bring a bottle of water in a transparent bottle with the label removed. The bottle must be placed on the floor, so it is not spilt on your paper.

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Before your exam (NEW)



On the morning of the exams **ALL students must go the amphitheatre including students in smaller rooms. If you go to the smaller rooms, you will be sent to the amphitheatre.**



You can sit anywhere in the amphitheatre; you do not need to sit in alphabetical order – sit where you want.



Students who use a word processor will collect their own laptop from the trolley (as you do now for lessons) and take it up to your exam room before you go to the amphitheatre for morning and afternoon exams. **You will be setting your laptop up yourself in the exam so please ensure it goes back in the cupboard on charge before each exam.** You will set up exam write pad using the instructions on the card when the invigilator tells you in your room. The instruction card will be on your exam desk.



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Seating arrangements (NEW)



Students in separate rooms will be dismissed from the amphitheatre first. Students in the sports hall will be dismissed from the amphitheatre in groups and walk in silence in single file to the sports hall and directly to your seat using the numbers and letters on the walls.



For example, if your seat is M4, walk along the back of the Sports hall up row M and to seat number 4.



You will not be called up or ticked in by anyone and will not be seated by the invigilators. This should make the start of the exam quicker and easier for you if you know your seat number.



Find your seat number by using the numbers and letters on the walls (letters at the front, numbers on the left-hand side).



Sit down at your exam desk, you will know you are in the correct place as your exam card will be on the desk. There will be seating plans in various places and staff will be on hand to help you. Please remember your seat number for each exam.

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Rules (in all rooms)

You must stay in silence from the moment you enter the sports hall or classroom and throughout the exam.

Do not touch your exam paper until the invigilator tells you.

As soon as everyone is seated the invigilator will start the exam, if you need anything put your hand up.

You will not be allowed to go to the toilet unless we are aware that you have a medical condition, invigilators know who these students are. Please go to the toilet before the exam.
